Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

A member of the church dropped off a book for me entitled, <u>Blessed Are the Chickenhearted (and 99 Other Beatitudes for Everyday Living)</u>. I was inspired by the 100th Beatitude, which happens to be the title. Here's a paraphrase from that section:

Whoever came up with the word chickenhearted doesn't really know much about chickens. According to Webster's Dictionary, chickenhearted means "to be timid, afraid, fearful, or cowardly." In our modern language, we say that people are "chicken" when they lack courage. We have become accustomed to hearing from anyone backing off from a dangerous task: "I chickened out."

But chickens are not cowardly. There's the story of a hen who had fourteen eggs placed under her. She faithfully hatched all fourteen. It took patience, courage, and stamina for 21 days in order for all the chicks to hatch. One afternoon a few weeks later, a storm blew in as the hen was busy gathering all of her chicks into the chicken coop. The winds whipped up, trees were starting to blow down, and the air was filled with debris. Suddenly, a terrible gust picked up the chicken coop and blew it across the yard. You would expect the hen and the chicks to be blown all over by the violent winds. But the hen stood resolute, with her wings stretched out over her brood. No matter how strong the wind blew, the hen stood unmoving until the storm had passed.

This story reminds me of Jesus' lament for Jerusalem in Luke 13:34 where He says, "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!"

Chickens are anything but cowardly. The person who came up with the term chickenhearted had a lot to learn about chickens. On the other hand, Jesus knew all about them, and He referenced chickens in his preaching, such as when Jesus predicted that Peter would deny him three times before the rooster crowed. His prediction came true, as Peter denied knowing Jesus for the third time in Matthew 26:74b and the rooster crowed.

Jesus also referenced chickens when he was talking about the end of the age in Mark 13:35-36, "Therefore, keep awake – for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."

As we move into the liturgical season of Advent, we have an opportunity to prepare for the coming of Christ into our lives, both at Christmas and when the Lord arrives at His second coming. Will we be ready? Let us move forward in our journey of faith, not fearful or chickenhearted, but with a sense of excitement and expectation.

Dear Consistory Members,

The parable of the ten bridesmaids in Matthew 25 reminds us of the importance of being prepared. Ten bridesmaids were waiting for the bridegroom to visit: five of them were wise and five were foolish. The wise bridesmaids had extra oil and wicks for their lamps, but the five foolish ones had not made extra provisions. As the bridegroom was delayed, all of the bridesmaids became drowsy and slept.

At midnight came the shout, "Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him." The bridesmaids quickly got up and prepared their lamps. The wise bridesmaids refilled their lamps with oil and they were burning bright. The foolish bridesmaids had run out of oil while they slept, and they had to go to the store to purchase more. While they were away, the bridegroom came by and the five bridesmaids who were prepared went on ahead with him into the banquet; and the door was shut. The foolish bridesmaids arrived to the party late, and they were not invited in.

As leaders of the church, we have an opportunity to make a positive impact in the life of First UCC. Our actions enhance the ministry of this faith community and the decisions we make as a group prepare this congregation for the challenges that lie ahead. Your ministry infuses oil into the lamp of First United Church of Christ. Thank you for your time and your efforts!

Bill's November 2017 Consistory report:

- *The *Feed My Starving Children* food pack event was held the last Thurs/Fri of October. 23 people from First UCC participated on Thursday 10/26 at Grand Avenue School 5 adults and 18 youth.
- *Stewardship Sunday is 11/19. The theme for this year is "Journey to Generosity". I feel this year's program is not as strong as it should be. I am hopeful that the Stewardship Committee, which is re-forming later this year, will give our church a shot in the arm when it comes to stewardship education. During my time in Sauk, First UCC finished in the red 2005-2011, four years in the black 2012-2015, and back to red 2016-2017. I believe that stewardship education and pledging are crucial moving forward.
- *I've had two funerals in the past month: Lucile Gasner and Kathleen Griffin.
- *I am coordinating the Salvation Army Bell Ringing schedule for the Sauk Prairie Community. First UCC is slated to ring at the Piggly Wiggly from 9am 5pm Friday 12/15 and Saturday 12/16.
- *The Niskas will perform at First UCC 12/2 at 7:30pm. Sign-up sheets have been put out to seek people to help with hospitality, tickets, and cleanup/setup of the chancel space.
- *Youth Retreat at the Kalahari Resort February 9-11, 2018. We ask that interested youth get their registration info/\$ to me by 11/26 in order for our group to qualify for the early bird rate.
- *I will be participating in the ecumenical community-wide Thanksgiving Eve Service 11/22 at 7pm. The worship service will be held @ St. John's Lutheran Church PdS.
- *\$4636 currently sits in the stained glass window account. In addition, a \$4000 memorial was recently given to church and the donating family thought that the stained glass window project would be a great place to put it.
