Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

The parable of the talents in Matthew 25:14-30 is a story of faithful stewardship. A master entrusts three servants to manage her wealth. To one she gave 5 talents (\$5,000,000), to another she gave 2 talents (\$2,000,000) and to another she gave 1 talent (\$1,000,000). And then she went away.

When the master came back, she asked for an accounting of how her servants had managed her wealth. The servant who was entrusted 5 talents had used those talents to make 5 more talents. The master was pleased, and said, "Well done! You have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things. Enter into the joy of your master." The same thing happened with the 2 talent servant. That servant used the 2 talents to make 2 more. The master was pleased and said, "...enter into the joy of your master."

But the 1 talent servant was afraid of the master and so he hid his talent in the ground. When the master came back and asked for an accounting of how he had managed her wealth, the servant gave the 1 talent back. He had not used the master's talent to make more. The master was most displeased.

What was the commandment the 1 talent servant violated? Murder, theft, adultery? No. Nothing like that. Let us keep in mind that the master in Jesus' parable could be interpreted as God and the servants could be representative of us. The 1 talent servant seemed like a good neighbor to have. He does no harm. But like a doctor afraid of being sued, the 1 talent servant was fearful of his master. He saw his master as being harsh and unreasonable. He didn't trust his master much either. It's hard to like someone you don't trust, much less love. The trust relationship in the parable was zero.

There was no way the 1 talent servant could obey the first commandment, to love God with all your heart and soul. His fear of God was not one of worshipful respect, but a mean-spirited fear that drives out love. It was not based on how little he had – he had \$1,000,000 – but on how little he trusted his master. The 1 talent man carried around an image of God that ruled out the relationship God wanted. When he looked in the mirror, he saw a fearful person because he believed in a God that was not for him, but out to get him. Trusting his life to a God like that was out of the question. So he dug a hole to save his life and lost it.

As with the talents, the decision on how we invest God's grace is ours. Our time. Our talents. Our offerings. The parable suggests two things we must do. First, to receive grace, we must trust in a gracious God who freely bestows grace on us. And then, we must commit ourselves to a lifelong investment and lose a bundle by freely bestowing grace on others. It's the best investment we will ever make.

Dear Consistory,

James son of Zebedee, and his brother John, were often concerned about their status and rank. They once had argued with the other disciples about who among them was the greatest. Another time, John complained when outsiders were exorcising demons in Jesus' name. James and John even had the audacity to ask Jesus for a special favor - they wanted to sit next to Jesus in heaven.

Jesus often used James and John's misunderstandings about the Kingdom as helpful teaching moments about ministry and discipleship. He encouraged the disciples to become great through selfless acts of service. "The last shall be first and the first shall be last."

I am thankful for each and every member of our consistory. You are leaders in our congregation because of your service and commitment to something larger than yourselves. You spend considerable time and energy on the ministry of the Sauk City First United Church of Christ, and you do it expecting no pat on the back or special reward. I am thankful for the work you do and the time you spend to make our ministry stronger. In terms of my report...

- 1.) As a reminder, I will be on vacation October 22-29. Kurt will lead the 8am service and we will host a neutral pulpit at the 10:30am service. First UCC Belleville's Search Committee will be here as they evaluate a candidate from within our Association.
- 2.) Our annual stewardship campaign is underway. Our theme this year is, "What Shall We Bring?" A letter promoting Stewardship Sunday will be sent out to the congregation later this week. Bulletin inserts, scripture readings and sermons over these next few weeks will focus on issues related to the use of our time, talents and financial resources. Our campaign will culminate on Sunday November 18. On that day we ask that all members and households consider making an offering pledge for 2019.
- 3.) Youth retreat in the Wisconsin Dells is scheduled for January 18-20, 2019. Cost is \$95 per participant + \$430 for each hotel room. In order to lock in the early bird rate, we need to register by November 13 (standard rate is \$120). Full payment is due upon registration and I will be using the First UCC credit card to make the payment. In the past, we've needed 4 hotel rooms to accommodate our group from First UCC (4 x \$430 = \$1720). A fundraiser will be launched to recover the cost of the hotel rooms. We broke even last year thanks to the generous support of the congregation.
- 4.) Periodic Vocational Support Retreat at Pilgrim Center is scheduled for November 11-12. I will not be in the office those days since I will have to be in Green Lake. This is a mandatory event for clergy in the Southwest Association.
- 5.) I have registered for the Credo Seminar to be held in Richmond, VA May 14-20, 2019. This seminar is for UCC pastors in my demographic (age, years of experience, etc.) Consistory approved my participation at last month's meeting. Cost is \$500. No money has exchanged hands yet, as I am still waiting to get a confirmation notification from the United Church of Christ that I will be part of the final group.
