Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

The adulation of sports fans is never a constant. A baseball player who is playing great is cheered by everyone. But if that same player happens to have a slump, a stretch where maybe they're not playing so well, they may hear some boos from the fans. 1982 was a great year for baseball in the city of St. Louis. The Cardinals had an outstanding season which led them to a World Series victory over the Brewers. The entire Cardinal baseball team was revered after winning that World Series. There were parades, celebrations, and the re-naming of local streets as a way to honor the players. The entire team became local celebrities and received considerable adulation from the fans in the St. Louis area.

Everyone had high expectations for the Cardinals in 1983. There were a number of key contributors from that 1982 championship team who were expected to come back strong. Unfortunately, it was not the best of years for the St. Louis Cardinals. Some of the players who did so well the year before were not able to produce. The Cardinal starting pitchers ended up with a dismal record. The hitters didn't hit the way they were supposed to. Whenever you have high expectations and they're not met, disappointment is likely to set in. By the middle of the 1983 season you could start to hear some boos trickling down from the stands. The same players that had been revered and celebrated just months before were now the subject of ridicule and scorn. It's amazing how quickly people can turn from cheering you to booing you.

As human beings, we are fickle, no doubt about it. We can change our minds in a hurry when it comes to fashion, music, and hairstyles. Of course, some things never change. One constant that we can all rely upon is the love of God shown to us through Jesus Christ.

The account of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem given in John's gospel is much shorter than Luke's or Mark's report. All that is emphasized in this text is the delirium of eager welcome that surrounded Christ as he rode into the city; an excitement which is here ascribed very largely to the raising of Lazarus. The streets were lined with dense mobs of excited and enthusiastic folk. But fame can be very fleeting. And human nature has showed that people will change their mind in a hurry. Later in the week, some of those same people who were shouting Jesus' praises would be the ones demanding his crucifixion.

Why the change in only 5 days? One minute you're loved and the next minute you're hated. Even Jesus' own disciples deserted Him in his time of greatest need; denying that they knew Him. And I wonder...are we as fickle in our lives? We think we are sincere lovers of the truth, that we want progress, and that we want to follow Jesus' way of life. We want to be part of His flock. And yet how often do we stray from our good shepherd when He demands things from us that we don't want to do? Jesus is the opposite of everything that is fickle—he is stable, constant, trustworthy, steady, reliable and dependable. May you always cheer Him on


