May you and I become the witnesses of this new creation so that we can be those whose trust roots deep into the soil of Easter. May God's remembrance be our life and hope for all time and beyond time, world without end.




#### **Easter Garden**

#### Annual Meeting Minutes First United Church of Christ March 3, 2019

- Call to order by Mark Pierick, Consistory President
- Opening Prayer by Pastor Bill
- Declaration of a quorum 56 members present
- Parliamentarian: Tim Homar
- Head Teller: Emily Fuchs Teller: Theresa Grimes
- Approval of minutes from the 2018 Annual Congregational Meeting of March 4, 2018: Motion to approve by Jackie Sliter, second by Kathy Johnson, motion carried.
- Approval of 2019 Budget, motion to approve by Cecy Haines, second by Denny Kahn, motion carried.
  - Motion by Tammy Young to move her offering counting position to an unpaid position, volunteer position, Dean Dahnert second, motion carried.
    - Discussion about if we would have to revisit with a new person in the role.
  - Question about investments. Tim Homar addressed explanation to move some funds to CD's for higher interest and flexibility to access money. Morgan Stanley account is not performing as well other opportunities.
  - Mission Possible funds are the Badger Steam and Gas fundraisers explanation of program by Sue and Tim Herbrand, started with the Mission group and expanded to other church and community programs
    - Volunteers determine which programs receive the funds they earn. This is a wonderful opportunity to do mission work.
  - o Tom Litscher requested the consideration of the salary for our pastor in the future.
- Approval of Committee Reports as presented in the Annual Report. Motion to approve by Tammy Young, second by Dianna Woerpel, motion carried.
- New Business: Upcoming Projects and Congregational Issues:
  - Consistory did not identify any capital projects for 2019. There are a number of smaller projects that will need attention.
    - Flooring and painting projects from last year was covered by donations.
    - Jamie Wittwer noted the white trim around the building is starting to have peeling paint and cement/brickwork starting crumble.
      - Dean Dahnert reviewed work done to help these issues and outlined work to be done to make improvements in the foundation and the cement and brick work.
    - Dianna Woerpel noted that the Parsonage needs attention in 2019. The driveway, steps, and painting will be addressed.
    - Sound system improvements are appreciated by Denny Kahn, the choir, and the community. Appreciation shared.
      - Dean Dahnert explained upgrades in the phone system has helped with the overall sound system and internet/wifi access.
  - Usher schedule would like to move to a sign-up process similar to how liturgists sign-up. Volunteers can sign-up by the week or take an entire month if they wish to do so. Sign-up will begin for April. Rita Larsen and Brigitta Brickl discussed that there may be an online version to sign-up, similar to the sign-up programs used in the schools.
    - Margaret McFarland brought up the need for a list of duties to be completed after each service.

- Kathy Johnson suggested to include the duties on the sign-up list so that people know the expectations.
- Tim Homar suggested to have training/reminders two times a year to review and also helps make connections between members.
- Carol Hehenberger suggested to send a letter to those who have ushered to explain the changes, that they are needed, and invite them to continue to attend and volunteer as ushers
- Dean Dahnert introduced a new Time & Talents project to have members consider how they can contribute the church and our needs.
- Brigitta Brickl volunteered to do more ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) safety training if it is desired.
- Correction to memberships Tom Litscher was not on Consistory in 2018. Peggy Ganser should have been listed.
- Mark Pierick confirmed that the summer service schedule will be one service from the first Sunday in June through the first Sunday September at 9:00AM. The service will have a radio broadcast at 9:00AM as well.
- Consistory Elections: Nominations for two positions, Tammie Huerth and Heather Miller.
   Motion to close and approve nominations by Tammy Young, second by Lois Pieper, motion carried.
  - Kurt Schultz and Chris Logterman accepted another three-year term. Motion to approve by Mark Pierick, second by Brigitta Brickl, motion passed.

The season of Lent is now upon us. Throughout this time of the liturgical year, Christians have an opportunity to examine our sinful nature and to engage in spiritual disciplines that bring us closer to Jesus Christ. It is humbling to know that God loves us so much, that God would give God's only son as an atoning sacrifice for our sin, so that we may find forgiveness and a fullness of grace. Let us walk with humility and hope as we follow Jesus to the cross.

In terms of my consistory report:

\*Kurt Schultz leading worship March 31.

\*First UCC hosts ecumenical Lenten Service Wednesday April 3. We are hosting twice in 2019. Offering proceeds will be donated to Sauk Prairie School Students In Need.

\*I have registered Kurt Schultz and myself for the Wisconsin Conference UCC Annual Meeting April 5-6 at the Wilderness in the Wisconsin Dells. I plan to go to required boundary training on Friday from 10am until the start of the meeting. I will also be at the meeting most of the day on Saturday.

\*The Bank of Prairie du Sac fraud department contacted me 3/12 regarding suspicious charges on church credit card. First UCC had just received a new card in the mail, but it had already been compromised by the time we received it. That card was suspended and a new credit card will be issued to the church in 7-10 business days.

\*The First UCC food stand ("Mission Possible") will be held May 3-5 and August 16-18 at the Badger Steam and Gasoline Engine Club. This has been a wonderful fund raiser for mission trips, church improvements (i.e. new utility shed) and community outreach (SP Students in Need). People can earn up to \$10 per hour to be applied toward their favorite cause (mission trip, Church, Sauk Prairie Music Association, etc.) We need 15 people per hour to run the food stand and we'd like to get more church members involved with this project. This can be an important alternative revenue stream for First UCC moving forward.

\*Compassion Sunday is on May 5. Our youth have supported a child, Dian from Indonesia, through Compassion International for 7-8 years. On Compassion Sunday we will hear more about this ministry and celebrate the work and efforts that our youth have put forth.

\*Credo program in Richmond, VA May 14-20. I have secured flight arrangements and filled out some biographical paperwork. More paperwork on the way.

\*Confirmation Sunday June 2 at 9am. Eight students to be confirmed.
