Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

Over the last year we have discovered a new way to be the church. It was born out of necessity as the pandemic limited our opportunities for indoor activities such as worship, Sunday school, church dinners, choir practice, meetings, etc. The lack of social interaction has been a challenge, especially for a faith community that thrives on handshakes, hugs and breaking bread together.

And yet, our ministry has continued to move forward in a positive way during this most uncertain time.

One of the biggest changes we have had to make is to offer virtual meetings and Christian education. Our choir meets weekly on zoom. Our consistory convenes on Google Meet. Our finance committee gathers on GoToMeeting. Our Sunday school gathers in the Bitmoji Classroom. The biggest change of all was the 2021 Annual Meeting, which was held virtually for the very first time. We found a way to overcome the challenges of the pandemic and to keep First UCC moving forward by meeting virtually.

The church website **ucc-saukcity.org** has really turned into a hub of activity over the past year. It has been a valuable tool for our church as people can access us and find all kinds of helpful information.

As the reliance upon our radio broadcasts grew during the pandemic, the quality of our radio broadcasts improved as well. New music was discovered with Mr. Kahn selecting the hymns. The church audio system was upgraded with new components in the sound booth. The clarity of our Sunday morning worship radio broadcasts were greatly enhanced by running it through the internet as opposed to the phone line. Members of the congregation signed up to be liturgists and to offer special music during a time when we could not sing in the sanctuary. We adapted to the challenge presented by the pandemic and found a way to greatly improve our radio outreach.

New video equipment is now being incorporated into our worship experience at First UCC. A large TV screen has been mounted on the wall in the sanctuary and cameras have been set in place so that a visual component can be offered, such as a YouTube link to our worship services. People at home will be able to follow along on their computer as the liturgy, scripture readings and song lyrics will scroll on the screen. The possibilities are exciting to think about as our church tries to find ways to utilize video technology for our own advantage as we move into the modern age and try to stay connected in this time of social distancing.

The ministry of First UCC will not look the same coming out of this pandemic. We will emerge as a new creation with skills and sensibilities developed in faithful response to an extraordinary challenge. Like a phoenix rising out of the ashes, we will come out of this memorable experience changed forever.

May God bless our ministry as we embrace today's challenges and tomorrow's promise.

I am grateful for your willingness to serve on our church's leadership board. The time and energy that you expend on behalf of our congregation is greatly appreciated by many in our faith community and will definitely strengthen our ministry moving forward.

The local church has sole autonomy over itself and the direction that its particular ministry takes.

In terms of my report:

- 1.) The Southwest Association Annual Meeting is scheduled to take place virtually on Saturday, May 8. The Wisconsin Conference UCC Annual Meeting is scheduled to take place virtually May 11-16. I plan to attend both meetings.
- 2.) I will be attempting to schedule pastoral care visits at the hospitals, assisted living, senior apartments, nursing homes and home visits once I receive the COVID vaccine and receive clearance to visit.
- 3.) There has been some confusion amongst the congregation regarding my sabbatical leave. The plan is that it will run from Monday, May 24 until Tuesday, August 17. I am incredibly grateful for this opportunity. In terms of worship programming, I will be absent May 30, the Sundays in June and July, and August 1, 8 and 15th. I will coordinate with families any postponed funerals or memorial services to make sure that those are addressed before I take my leave.


