Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

"...On the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven and sittith on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead..."

Matthew 25:31-46 references The Great Judgment, a time when the Son of Man will come and sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will gather before him and he will separate people as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. At first glance, it might appear to the casual reader that the Christian is simply defined as a good humanitarian. We have a ready-made list to build on. All we have to do is maintain a log to keep track of our efforts. Be sure and include the dates and times of your good deeds. That way, we can use them as talking points for heavenly entrance.

Looking further, we find that there are two groups considering the same list with different perspectives. Looking at the outcome, we'll want to be in the first one. The first group, perhaps wearing T-shirts with a sheep printed on the front, did the following: They provided food for the hungry, water for the thirsty, hospitality for the stranger, clothing for the naked, treatment for the sick, and visits for the prisoner. The other group, the goats, looked the other way when they saw someone hungry, thirsty, a stranger, naked, sick, or in prison. That's simple enough, isn't it? But then comes the twist.

Both groups were puzzled when Jesus said, "I was the one you saw hungry and thirsty. I was the person that you saw in need of clothes, medical help, or friendship for the stranger and the prisoner. I was the one you aided or from whom you turned away." What's going on here? Why weren't the sheep aware of doing good deeds for Jesus? Couldn't they see the face of Jesus in the people they helped? Apparently not. "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food?" They sound clueless. Why?

I think it has to do with their enjoyment of a favorite thing. I'm sure you can think of things you do simply for the love of your favorite thing – cards, gardening, hunting, etc. Is that the way it is with these helpful people in Matthew's text? The helpers didn't say, "I am doing this for the love of Jesus." They did it because they couldn't imagine not doing it. "Anyone would have done the same," they say. But that's not true; too many people look the other way. Our hearts, through Christ's Spirit, are shaped and taught with the help of other Christians. As we become more conformed to Christ, our actions will develop more spontaneously and we will be a blessing to others. The outcome is described in John 7:38: "Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water."

The goats never found the living waters. Instead they dammed them up and the water became stagnant. The sheep go along with the flow of the Spirit; they respond to needs and love doing it.

Maybe one day, you'll be sitting in the doctor's office reading a year-old magazine. The waiting room will be completely full. The door opens and an elderly woman on crutches comes in out of the cold. You'll immediately get up and say, "I was just going to get a cup of coffee. Would you like one too?" You do it because the love of Jesus is written on your heart. Now you know how it is with the sheep that seemed so unaware.






