Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

Living in community is never easy. This is especially true when it comes to the Church of Jesus Christ. An incorrect assumption is often made that members of the Church should always get along in perfect harmony, because after all, it is a Christian community. But the fact of the matter is that the people of the Church are a blend of varying histories, traditions, outlooks and understandings. Disagreements can sometimes arise due to these differences.

Disagreements in the life of the Church are nothing out of the ordinary. Conflict has been a part of Church life since the earliest days of the Christian Church. Paul wrote his letter to the Romans partly because of conflict that had arisen there. The Church in Rome was a mixture of Jewish and Gentile believers. At that point in time they were experiencing significant tensions between these two groups.

In the fourth chapter of Paul's letter to the Philippians, Paul urged two women in that Church "to be of the same mind in the Lord". Paul wrote the epistle partly because he heard of quarrels which had broken out in the life of the Church. One quarrel in particular had grieved him, since the two women involved were both very dear to him. He wanted Euodia and Syntyche to consider their dispute in a Christian spirit and to come to some sort of an agreement. The two women were among the most active workers in the Church, and had been so from the beginning.

Paul wrote his letter to the Colossians because of conflict that had arisen there. It seems that Church was coming under the influence of false teachings. Various traditions from different religions were blended to come up with something new. Greek philosophy, cultic practices, Christianity and Jewish speculation were blended together to offer a "fuller" type of spiritual experience. In this letter, Paul presented Jesus as the true Lord of the universe and highlighted love, thankfulness, and forgiveness as the marks of true spirituality.

When conflict happens within the Church, it must be dealt with in a positive Christian way. Jesus taught us in Matthew 18 that when conflict arises, we are to immediately go to that person in the spirit of Christian reconciliation. We are to point out the concern privately. If that approach doesn't work, then perhaps we ask 1 or 2 members to help mediate. The purpose is not to humiliate or condemn, but to regain a brother or sister in Christ. In addition to dealing with disagreement proactively, we ought to be willing to forgive. After all, we are forgiven sinners. We are called to offer that same forgiveness to our brother or sister in Christ.

I am excited to still be a part of First UCC in Sauk City, WI. We have challenges like everyone else, but overall we address our issues in a healthy and productive way. Let us deal with our disagreements by looking to Jesus Christ for guidance and inspiration.


