I have recently been reading the Epistles of Paul. It's remarkable how timeless these words of

scripture are. Paul's words for the early church are just as relevant today as they were back in his time. He tells us in Colossians 3:

"As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you."

This passage always strikes me as a prescription for living the good Christian life. Paul is keen to helping the letter's intended recipients navigate their day-to-day lives with as much positivity as he can. The aim is not simply laying down a set of rigid rules that must be followed no matter what. Rather, the aim is steady, gentle encouragement through reminders of whose children we are, and how God's children ideally act at every possible moment.

Impossible to do? Perhaps for us. But as we're told in the Gospel according to Luke, "Nothing will be impossible with God." God has a way of doing the impossible. We often forget, ignore, or refuse to believe that. The Bible is full of examples, but so are our day-to-day lives. Our life can become so much better when we step out of our own way, get out of God's way, and let the Almighty guide us into the future.

We can help by working to accomplish what the writer of Colossians prescribes. With hearts, minds, and actions steeped in, "compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience," with lives filled with tolerance, acceptance, and forgiveness, with intentional efforts to concentrate on Christ's harmony, peace, and word, we can live lives that will change the world in every good and potential-filled way.

Does that, too, seem impossible? Add to the mix a posture of love, unending worship, praise and thankfulness, and there is no end to the wonders that God will guide us into. Imagine the world that could be!

We can start the way we start most good things, by beginning these practices in our own lives, our own homes, our own workspaces, with our own families, and our own friends. Even in our own place of worship, with our own sisters and brothers in faith. Anywhere. Anytime. Everywhere.

We can exist with friction and dissention in any area of life, or we can thrive in impossible grace and the bounteous life that comes along with it. The choice is ours. Each one. Each day.

#### Developing Inclusivity and Selfless Hospitality

Dear Members of The First United Church of Christ-Sauk City Congregation,

The Open & Affirming Sub-Committee, consisting of Pastor Bill, Shirlee Lendved, Tammie Huerth, Dennis Kahn, Christy Kinnamon, Barb Sprecher & Dean Sprecher has been working for almost three years on an Open & Affirming initiative for First UCC-Sauk City.

We have hosted a Panel Discussion with Laura McLeod, Chair of the UCC Conference ONA Committee; a Meet & Greet with members of our Sub-Committee; Bible Studies on both the Old and New Testaments, led by Pastor Bill; a film in the Sanctuary "For the Bible Tells Me So"; a book study on the book "Raising Ryland"; a book talk on "The Gay History of Wisconsin" by author Dick Wagner; and music during our October 10 service by Common Chords.

In addition, we have sent out an initial Congregational Assessment, an ONA questionnaire, and a survey; and a quarterly edition of the D.I.S.H., a newsletter to share information and resources with you, the Congregation of First UCC.

The ONA Sub-Committee has worked openly and diligently to inform all members of our church of the reasons for moving toward an Open & Affirming designation for First UCC. Based on the results of the survey taken last fall, we feel that our congregation is ready to vote.

The vote will be based on a Covenant that we have drafted, which states that we wish to send a clear message to the LGBTQ+ community, as well as all people regardless of race, nationality, culture, ethnicity, age, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ability, socio-economic status, faith background, family structure, or education, that they have a home in the United Church of Christ — Sauk City. Before we vote, however, we want to engage the members of First UCC on the wording of the draft; we will then consider comments and suggestions, and tweak the statement as needed. Remember, this is not only a policy, statement, or declaration, but a **covenant**—which is a binding promise to "walk together in all God's ways".

The vote will take place at our Annual Meeting on March 6. The percentage of votes needed to pass this resolution will be 75% of those present at the meeting (in person or virtually).

Please prayerfully review this draft of the First UCC Open & Affirming Covenant, and **send any comments or questions to the ONA Sub-committee by February 15**. Thank you!

#### **Draft of the First UCC-Sauk City ONA Covenant:**

"Accept one another, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God." (Romans 15:7)

In order to embrace the inclusive love of Jesus Christ, First United Church of Christ - Sauk City, WI, seeks to be an expression of God's love in the world. We value and welcome a diverse congregation, inviting all to worship with us—regardless of race, nationality, culture, ethnicity, age, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ability, socio-economic status, faith background, family structure, or education.

First UCC strives to foster loving and caring relations in our church, community and world by becoming an Open & Affirming church, and issuing a public welcome to send a clear message to the LGBTQ+ community—and all people regardless of race, nationality, culture, ethnicity, age, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ability, socio-economic status, faith background, family structure, or education—that they have a home in the United Church of Christ — Sauk City. It is about embracing the diversity of human nature and celebrating the inherent uniqueness, potential and contributions of all persons. Many voices, many hands, and shared wisdom from varied perspectives and life experiences make us stronger and richer in thought, creativity, and growth. This is a journey together in faith toward greater understanding and mutual respect, showing our unity in Christ. It is also a commitment to social justice, and opens us up to other issues that beg for our attention.

All are invited to fully share and participate in the leadership, ministry, fellowship, worship, sacraments, responsibilities, blessings and joys of our church family.

No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here in this First United Church of Christ - Sauk City.


#### Important Dates in the LGBTQ+ Community

International Transgender Day of Visibility (TDOV), March 31, is a day to show your support for the Trans community. It brings attention to the accomplishments of Trans people around the globe while fighting cissexism and transphobia by spreading knowledge of the trans community.

**Day of Silence, April 8, 2022** (day varies from year to year...2nd Friday in April) is a student-led national event that brings attention to anti-LGBT name-calling, bullying and harassment in schools. Students from middle school to college take a vow of silence in an effort to encourage schools and classmates to address the problem

of ant-LGBTQ behavior by illustrating the silencing effect of bullying and harassment on LGBT students and those perceived to be LGBT.

# JANUARY 2022 MINUTES

The Stewardship Committee met virtually on January 13. All members were present with the exception of Tom Litscher who had a conflict.

Marcy Thurwachter updated the committee on the status of the Capital Campaign. 2021 ended with several donations which have raised the current total to \$20,674. There will be continued messages, Facebook posts, and Scoop articles designed to keep the First UCC members engaged in the campaign. Marcy asked if there was a plan in the event the goal is not met. Linda Lehan is the consistory's representative to the finance committee and shared that finance has begun discussions related to this issue.

Pastor Bill reported that a total of \$286.17 was collected from the Salvation Army kettle campaign. Pastor Bill will get a cashier's check to forward to the Salvation Army. No other churches participated this year.

The committee reviewed the assignments for stewardship messages which are given once a month during the church service. Tom Litscher has January, Sherri Roberts will be in February, and Marcy will have March.

Marcy shared that the December Stock the Schools drive was very successful. Due to an abundance of PB & J in the school district, those items were taken to the SP Area Food Pantry. Shampoo and conditioner were delivered to the middle school. Pastor Bill will take over delivery during January, February, and March, in Marcy's absence. Cathy, the church secretary, will be asked to put the bin out and bring it in daily.

Marcy reminded the committee that last year they had talked about a Lenten program called 40 Acts of Kindness. Committee members had received an email explaining the program. Marcy would try to find the original email and resend it. After review, the committee will decide whether to promote the program.

The meeting was adjourned and the next meeting date was left as TBD.
