Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

It was an absolute joy to worship in our beautiful church park on Father's Day, the first time we've worshipped together publicly since March 8th.

COVID-19 has caused many changes throughout the world and in the life of our church. Even though we've not been able to gather in-person as a community of faith, our ministry has continued to move forward in a positive way. We have shown that First United Church of Christ is about much more than a building – it's about the people. Thanks to all of you who have supported this church through your generous gifts of offerings, time and talents in 2020. Your support is greatly appreciated!

I'm incredibly appreciative for the church consistory. Nothing could have prepared our leadership board for this unprecedented time, and they have risen to the challenge. Your consistory has met regularly online and in person since this outbreak has happened. Recently, the consistory has been working diligently to reopen our sanctuary for public worship. There are many considerations to make and a considerable amount of time has been put into developing procedures and precautions – they have met 5 of the past 6 Thursdays. I can't say enough about this group of layleaders, and I hope you're able to thank them personally for their time and dedication to First UCC.

Beginning July 5, we will resume indoor worship. We plan to have a 9am (mask required) worship service and a 10:30am (mask optional) worship service. It is a supreme challenge to meet all the needs of our faith community and there are no perfect solutions that will fit everyone perfectly. I am sorry if you are feeling as if your needs are not being met with our new changes. They have been made with the recommendation of the Sauk County Health Department and the Wisconsin Council of Churches. We are trying to make our worship space as safe as possible. Please keep an eye out for an all-church mailing that will explain the new worship procedures and reasons behind the changes.

As always, until a vaccine is developed and distributed, we cannot guarantee you will be 100% safe from contracting COVID-19 if you attend worship at First UCC. The safest options remain using the radio and the computer to connect on Sunday mornings. It is also been proven that wearing a mask helps to cut down on the transmission of droplets and aerosols into the air. Remember, it's not about **me**, it's about **we**. Wearing a mask is one way we can show love and kindness to our neighbor.

I want to personally reach out to our shut-in members and those with pre-existing health conditions who will not be able to worship publicly at church. I want to visit you this summer in the safety and security of your backyard as part of my "Pastor on the Porch" initiative. The idea is that I will come to your home with folding chair and communion. You can sit on your porch and I can sit on your lawn or driveway. We will socially distance in responsible way and I will bring a mask to wear.

Dear Consistory,

I would like to take an opportunity to thank you for all the extra time and attention you have given the church over these last few weeks.

This upcoming meeting will be our 3rd Thursday in a row getting together (and we have met 4 of the past 5 Thursdays). I am so grateful for your willingness to be leaders in our church during this challenging time.

Five of you formed a sub committee in May to work on ways to get our church back together for public worship. You have had two extra meetings in order to come up with solutions to seating, cleaning procedures and other logistical issues. I have bombarded you with articles and resources about the COVID-19 virus. I have given you all the information from the Wisconsin Council of Churches regarding new ways of worshiping (such as no singing due to increased aerosols in the air). These are not easy changes to make, and yet, you are doing your best to find ways to cut down the potential transmission of the virus in our church. I am so appreciative of you and for all you are doing on behalf of the members of First United Church of Christ.

Each person has had a specific role to play in our reopening process. I am hopeful that we can come up with plans and procedures for indoor worship in the near future. In the meantime, we will enjoy our beautiful church park as we get back together as a faith community.

You have gone over and above the call of duty serving on the First UCC Consistory. These are unprecedented times and I am grateful you are leading our church forward in a positive way.

In terms of my Pastor's report:

1. I am going to try to re-introduce some pastoral home visits over the summer. I will call this initiative: "Pastor on the Porch".

The idea is that our church members could come out onto their porch (or patio) with a chair, and I would be in my own lawn chair sitting on their driveway or in their yard a healthy distance away. This might be a nice way to make connections in a socially responsible manner.

I will promote this opportunity over the next few weeks and people can just call the church office (643-8387) or call me (370-2249) to set up a visit. I would love to visit and summer is the perfect opportunity to do so outside.

- 2. I am meeting with Scott Kinnamon on Friday to talk more about how we could set up online live streaming for our worship services moving forward. This will be a nice supplement to connect with our members (in addition to the radio broadcast) during this COVID-19 era. I am thinking this can be a viable option even when we begin having public worship again. Many of our at risk members may choose to play it safe at home.
- 3. I have a funeral this Friday at Hooverson funeral Home. The family initially wanted it at our church, and I told them we were not ready to have the public in our church building yet. As soon as we come up with details on COVID-19 procedures, we may be able to once again open up to the public for funerals in the future.
- 4. I have reserved the church park for Sunday, July 26, from 4 to 7 PM to host my oldest child's high school graduation party. There will be live music from the "Hard Tellin' Band" and all the ingredients for root beer floats will be made available. We will encourage attendees to bring their own picnic baskets, blankets, chairs and yard games. Members and friends of the First UCC Faith Community are invited.
- 5. Kirsten Perry/Nick Sarac wedding re-scheduled for August 1 in the First UCC church park. I indicated that the wedding party and family would be granted access to the church to get ready for the ceremony but that we would

not have public bathrooms available. This may change as we develop procedures for in-church activity during COVID-19.

6. I would like to take my 2nd week of vacation August 3-10, 2020. We would need pulpit supply for August 9. I believe Kurt said he is unavailable but perhaps we can schedule something for that date.
