Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

Are you afraid of change, or do you look for it? Sometimes, we can be so set in our ways that we miss seeing how things could be enhanced by implementing a new idea.

During Jesus' time, even then, people longed for change. For years, they had been living under Roman rule. The desire to be free from this tyranny ran strong. They were living under spiritual leaders that either compromised their heritage to get along with Rome or under spiritual leaders that were so strict that the enjoyment of life was taken away. It was all so oppressive.

But Jesus came to offer something better. When Jesus came on the scene, he offered hope by saying, "Things can be different. Something good is here, something better, something available...now." And in offering this hope, Jesus cast a vision of a better Kingdom, now and in the future.

Jesus spoke a message of repentance. Repentance means that we have a necessary change of mind. Our views change. Our values and goals change. To repent means that we turn away from sin and turn to God. But as with anything, to wrestle something out of its accustomed course is often a painful process.

Jesus' message was also about hope. There is hope in God's Kingdom. It is a Kingdom where the poor matter to God as much as the rich, where those who mourn will be comforted, where the meek win, where those who hunger and thirst for righteousness will be filled, where mercy is the order of the day, where the pure in heart will see God, where peacemakers are the heroes.

Jesus gave a vision for something different than what they were living. He offered change and the revolution began. Those listeners became followers. What about us? What are the small ways in which we can change to enhance our walk with Christ? We are called to live out the Kingdom of God here and now. It can be challenging no doubt, especially if there are changes that are needed. But in the end, we can demonstrate that we live under God's gracious rule, for it is the way to peace and fulfillment.










SINGING & MUSIC AT FIRST CHURCH from your Music Director Dennis Kahn

Greetings one and all. The past 14+ months have been a strange, new and challenging experience concerning music at First Church. When everything shut down a year ago March, we tried to follow the best available information about live music in our worship setting. Some of the early recommendations and advice proved to be spot on and some eventually needed to be modified. Having attended virtual seminars on transmission and safe practices, I am confident that we were prudent and correct in adopting the policies we've set in place. As a church that is based on caring and love, I would hope you would agree that erring on the conservative, safe side not only helped prevent the spread but also provided a safe and comfortable space for worship in the sanctuary. Even now as we are seeing more and more folks vaccinated, it is my recommendation that we continue the safe practices until we are assured that "herd immunity" is achieved. If you are attending worship in the sanctuary and wearing a mask, you can safely sing in a subdued voice behind your mask on the Gloria Patri and Doxology. If you are not wearing a mask, I would encourage you to "sing in spirit" only. It is my greatest desire to hear not only the First Choir live in the sanctuary, but also the entire congregation "belting" out hymns once again. We are so close to achieving this goal, but we're not there yet.

Remember that those with compromised immune systems, children and the unvaccinated are still at risk and need our understanding, cooperation and support as we work to our goal. On an additional note, it has been my great pleasure to be selecting the hymns for the worship services. There are over 600 possibilities in the New Century Hymnal and in most cases, people tend to like to sing the same "old" familiar hymns. It is like the wardrobe situation where one wears 20% of their clothes 80% of the time. Hearing new hymns and learning about them isn't a negative, but just different. Rest assured that we will be able to sing the "oldies and goodies" hopefully in the near future.

 - o Building & Maintenance
 - o The furnace in the parsonage requires some repairs and the specifics will be discussed, so that we can authorize the expense. Repairs can be made, or the furnace can be replaced with a more efficient unit.
 - Barb Sprecher made the motion to fix the parsonage furnace at a cost of \$450. Tammy Young seconded. Motion passed.
 - Marcy asked if the contractors for the parsonage porch would consider maintenance free composite materials instead of wood as it lasts longer and requires less maintenance.

We have a quote from Ever Ready Electric to perform the work needed in the church. This only effects our elevator.

 - We have finally had two contractors, who specifically restore church masonry, look at our Bell Tower and provide quotes for two different approaches to the restoration of the Bell Tower exterior.


