Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

Gun violence is prevalent in our society, and sadly, it's not going away. There have been 32 mass shootings (four or more people shot in one incident) in the U.S. during the first six weeks of 2018. Schools, concert halls, cinemas, ball fields, night clubs, and even churches have experienced tragedy due to active shooter events.

We are divided as a nation in terms of how to address it. Many points of view see poor mental health as the primary reason behind these events. Fix the mental health problem and the number of shootings will go down. Other points of view insist that enacting gun safety legislation is the way to go. Getting rid of certain accessories (i.e. bump stocks) might limit the damage inflicted by an active shooter in the future. There are many viewpoints on how to address gun violence, but no clear path on how to move forward.

Many schools and places of business have taken steps to be better prepared in the event of an active shooter situation. It has been suggested that our church ought to have a plan as well.

I would like to introduce you to ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate). This is a training model utilized by the Sauk Prairie School District and is being implemented locally and around the state. These training sessions teach about personal safety and developing a plan in case of an active shooter situation.

ALICE training will be offered at First UCC on three separate occasions:

- 1.) Sunday March 11 @ 11:30am
- 2.) Tuesday March 27 @ 9:30am
- 3.) Thursday April 12 @ 5:30pm

A member of our congregation, Brigitta Brickl, will lead the ALICE training and officers from the Sauk Prairie Police Department will be on hand at all three sessions to serve as a resource. We will learn about personal safety, awareness strategies, and basic lifesaving concepts such as barricading, evacuation, and counter measures. This training will last about two hours, is free of charge and open to the public. Please consider participating. Not only can we be better prepared as a faith community to deal with this growing threat, but we'll have resources at our disposal that can be utilized no matter where we are in this world.



Dear Consistory,

The season of the Church year known as Lent has now begun. Lent is a 40 day stretch (minus Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Easter. It is a time of penitence and reflection of our sinful nature and the incredible debt of sin we have accumulated. Lent is also a time when the weekly scripture lessons reveal that Jesus' mission was to be an atoning sacrifice for our sins. He was to serve as the Lamb of God who would take away the sin of the world.

Even though Lent is traditionally a somber time, it can be a great time in the life of First UCC. To have our membership engaged in Lenten disciplines, to see increased worship numbers with the Wednesday ecumenical services, and to experience the Lenten drama unfold once again can really give our congregation a positive boost. For six weeks we are moved emotionally and spiritually as Jesus makes his way to the cross.

In terms of my consistory report:

- Mission trip informational/organizational meeting scheduled for Sunday February 18 after the 10:30am worship service. We will go over logistics, fees, fund raising, etc. related to the June 16-24 trip to Back Bay Mission.
- Ecumenical services will happen on Wednesday nights @ 6:30pm during Lent. Each participating church will host. First UCC is up to host on February 21.
- A Ministerial Discernment Committee is being formed on behalf of Kurt Schultz. He is seeking licensed ministry in the United Church of Christ. I have a meeting planned with the committee chair on Friday 2/23 as we get the ball rolling.
- I will have a pre-recording of the March 4 radio broadcast prepared. That is Annual Meeting Sunday and we will worship at 9am. I will run the tape up sometime during the week.
- A.L.I.C.E. Training (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) will be made available at First UCC Sunday March 11 after church, during the day on Tuesday March 27, and in the evening on Thursday April 12. This training is to help better prepare the church in case of an active shooter event.


