I couldn't agree more. Sometimes we get so preoccupied with the busyness of our lives that we lose sight of all the good things we already have. Gratitude is the quality of **recognizing** the blessings of life, **acknowledging** that those blessings have come, and then **appreciating** the benefits those blessings bring us.

A person who exemplified the qualities of gratitude was a man in my former congregation by the name of Ervin. He was a successful attorney who became wealthy by the way of real estate, mostly through farm transactions. Ervin came from humble farming roots himself, and he never changed despite his riches. Ervin didn't drive a fancy car. He and his wife lived in the same humble abode for their entire married life. He came into the office every day, even into his late 80's, dressed in a suit and tie. Ervin lived a very simple life, and he always spoke about how thankful and grateful he was.

In the last years of his life, Ervin donated the funds to build a new library for the community. He spared no expense. A driving force behind Ervin's gift was a huge sense of gratitude. He wanted to give back to the community that had been so good to him. One of Ervin's favorite Bible verses that he quoted was, "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good" (Psalm 106:1).

I believe a sense of gratitude can improve our attitude toward life and other people. It can make us happier and even reduce our stress. Being thankful is a recognition that God has been good to us.

What can we do to cultivate a spirit of gratitude in our lives? Here are a few easy steps:

- Find something positive in your life and choose to be grateful for it. If we focus on finding the good out of every situation, we can discover that our lives can be filled with immense gratitude.
- Write it down. Journaling is a helpful way to document and remember the joys of life.
- Let's learn to say, "Enough". As Paul writes in Philippians 4:11-13, "I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances". He adds that we are most content when we realize we can do anything with God in our lives.

For all these reasons I am grateful.


## Christian Fellowship February
