Dear Members and Friends of First UCC,

Psalm 23 is both familiar and beloved. Together with the Lord's Prayer, Psalm 23 is a scripture passage that is so treasured that countless generations of Christians have learned it by heart. The psalm evokes comforting images of gentle landscapes and pastoral care.

This psalm invited us to meditate and reflect on the goodness of God and God's unwavering love for us. The psalmist captures our imagination with the metaphor of God as our shepherd: leading us beside still waters, making us lie down in green pastures, comforting us with God's rod and staff, guiding us through the valley of the shadow of death.

While the imagery can be so familiar for us, so woven into the fabric of Christian language that we barely notice it anymore, it remains powerful and deep. It is a language of close connection and trust. The language of shepherd and sheep provides rich imagery about God's relationship with us. Shepherds in the ancient world lived with their sheep. They remained with them night and day, watching over them and protecting them from human thieves and wild predators.

The words of the 23rd psalm also give voice to the full reality of our human experience, with all of its blessings and challenges. While we may know the joy of green pastures and still waters, the pleasure of full plates and overflowing cups, and the contentment that comes from resting until we feel fully restored and rejuvenated, we also walk through the valley of the shadow of death. We experience danger. We have enemies. There are places of scarcity. We stray from the paths where God seeks to lead us.

Yet, even in these dark valleys of fear, danger, suffering or despair, we need fear no evil. The Lord is our shepherd. God's shepherding care enables us to walk safely through the valley, secure in the promise that God's goodness and mercy shall follow us all the days of our life, and we shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

As people of faith, whenever we walk through the valley of deepest shadow, we recognize that we also stand in the shadow of the cross of Christ. As our good shepherd, Jesus has taken the full weight of human experience, with all of our suffering and pain, upon himself, bearing it with us and for us. As we live in the shadow of the cross, we also proclaim the promise of Easter. God our shepherd stands among us with strength and courage. Christ is our good shepherd, who walks with us, guiding us, directing us, and making all things new. God's goodness is unwavering. Our good shepherd's love for us is steadfast and unending. This is the faith that carries us onward, through the dark valley, into the green pastures, beside the still waters, where goodness and mercy follow us all the days of our life.


