Dear Members and Friends of First UCC.

Have you ever heard the story of blind Bartimaeus? He was a man, by any account, who had very little going for him. Mark's gospel (10:46-52) tells us that Bartimaeus (or "Bart" for short) was stranded on the outskirts of Jericho. He may have even lived on the streets. Bart was poor and had to depend on others because of his condition. All Bart could do was sit along the roadside, begging, hoping kindhearted travelers would spare him a few coins.

Now, in all honesty, we would have to say that Bart's future looked gloomy. His life seemed hopeless and all he could do was survive. No enjoyment. No happiness. No success. No peace. No joy. Bart's major concern in life was simple survival. That is, until the day a special passerby, Jesus, came along. Bart asked Jesus for healing and his eyesight was restored. It was a gift that would change Bart's life forever and help him to not just survive, but to thrive!

What can we learn from Bart's story? What can we glean from him that will help us get plugged in to the plan that God has for our life? How can we move beyond merely surviving and start to thrive? I want to share with you three ways:

- 1.) Capitalize on the opportunities God provides for us.
- 2.) Minimize the negative voices that clatter around us.
- 3.) Exercise the faith available to us.

Once Bart discovered that Jesus was close to him, he shouted out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" What do you think triggered that request? Was he simply begging as he had always done? How did he know of Jesus' miraculous powers? I don't know for sure, but however Bart knew about Jesus, he sensed that he had an opportunity to get help and he acted upon the opportunity. Bart pleaded with Jesus and he was healed. Bart capitalized on the opportunity placed before him by God. God may offer and offer something to us but if we refuse to accept it, the opportunity will be missed.

Notice the crowd's reaction when Bart cried out for help. They rebuked Bart and told him to be quiet. But he didn't listen. Bart didn't cater to the negative words being said to him and that is a helpful lesson for us to learn as well. We must never try to please those who criticize us because we will never make them happy. Bart was not going to let a bunch of negative, critical, heckling bystanders rob him of his dream of sight.

Bart's boldness got him recognized. It got Jesus' attention and opened the door for his healing. But make no mistake, the reason that Jesus healed Bart was not because of his boldness, but because of his faith. It was Bart's faith that triggered Jesus' healing power. Jesus said to him, "Go, your faith has healed you." And Bart followed Jesus on the way.

I can only imagine what Bart's powerful testimony must have been like as he followed Jesus. Genuine faith is contagious, it cannot wait to tell others. Beloved, stop settling for less! Don't just survive, thrive! Thrive through Jesus Christ and your faith in him. Bart did and we can too!

Trust in the **Promise**


"For surely I know the plans I have for you...to give you a future with hope."

This fall our congregation will be focusing on the stewardship theme "Trust in the Promise." You will be hearing more about this theme through sermons and personal stories shared by members of our church.


