Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network (a network of thousands of UCC justice and peace advocates), Justice and Witness continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties. environmental and Neighbors in Need also supports our American Indian neighbors in the UCC. One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable from dozens of other tribes and nations members of other UCC who are congregations in the U.S.

We also hosted the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual First UCC Cow Chip Chicken Dinner on August 30. We had exemplary leadership and participation from a wide variety of members to make this event a success. Special thanks to our event coordinator, Chris Logterman, and to Galen Alwin, who prepared the chicken for the dinner.

In addition, the First UCC Fall picnic occurred on September 8. Special thanks to the Christian Fellowship for organizing the meal, the Sunday school for organizing the scavenger hunt/wagon ride, and to Galen Alwin, who made some tasty pork chops and chicken.

Our new program year has fully kicked into gear and I am excited beyond compare! The First UCC Choir started rehearsing on September 4 and God has blessed us with fabulous leadership and a nice turnout of singers thus far. There is a potential for me to be called for jury duty anytime throughout the entire month of October, but I will try to keep you posted.
- 4.) Wisconsin Conference UCC/UEK Working Group is scheduled to meet at the Wisconsin Conference UCC office October 23 from 10am-noon. I plan to attend. As a reminder, I'm leading the next installment of our Young Ambassadors Youth Exchange with the Moers Church District in 2020/2021. Cost is \$1650 per youth for the June 23-July 14, 2020 Germany trip. We host July 7-23, 2021. The church will help the youth raise at least ½ the \$ amount with fund raising.
- 5.) I have one more week of vacation to use before the end of 2019. I will try to get something on the schedule asap.

# A Message to the Congregation of First United Church of Christ from the Open & Affirming Sub-Committee

A little over a year ago, the First UCC Consistory and the Stewardship Committee began having a conversation about our church's identity. It started with discussions on how to engage our membership, retain members, attract new members, and how to keep our youth from wandering off after confirmation or graduation. It seems that we always look inward—more potlucks, activities, Bible studies, various groups. And those ARE important in the life of our church; but maybe it's time we began to truly be a part of the wider community of Christ. Regarding our church's identity, to most people in the community, we are known as the "red brick church" on Madison St. & Washington Ave. Members of Consistory and Stewardship agree that it's time we take a look at what we want to be known for, and how we can begin the journey toward becoming a part of the wider community of Christ.

There are so many issues out there that cry out for contemplation, advocacy, and action. No one church can even attempt to take on every issue, but there are some where precedent has successfully been set, and where leadership is there, willing to help us find our way. A couple of years ago, someone in our congregation remarked at the Annual Meeting that we are an Open & Welcoming church. So what does that really mean? That was the question that prompted some of us to look into becoming an Open & Affirming church. Becoming Open & Affirming means that a church publicly affirms LGBTQ+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning, + Intersexual and Asexual) people, welcoming them fully into the life and ministry of the church. The 15<sup>th</sup> General Synod has adopted the Resolution titled "Calling on UCC Congregations to Covenant as Open & Affirming".

More than 1200 congregations in our denomination have adopted Open & Affirming covenants. While the First UCC in Sauk City proclaims that "all are welcome", many LGBTQ+ people have learned that it often doesn't apply to them because they can't assume that any church will be safe for them and their families. By issuing a public welcome from an Open & Affirming church, it sends a clear message to the LGBTQ+ community that they have a home in the United Church of Christ. It is about embracing the diversity of human nature, and celebrating the inherent uniqueness, potential and contributions of all persons. Many voices, many hands, and shared wisdom from varied perspectives and life experiences make us stronger and richer in thought, creativity, understanding and growth. This is a journey together in faith toward greater understanding and mutual respect, showing our unity in Christ.

Our intent is to be completely transparent and open with you, our fellow members of the congregation here at First UCC. So far, we have met a few times to gather information and decide whether to proceed. We are now at the point where we have determined that we need to present what we have learned to the congregation. Our first step will be to ask all of our members to complete the Congregational Assessment and Welcoming Process Outline, which can be done anonymously. This will give us an idea of how to move forward, and will be followed by listening sessions, panel discussions, Bible study, and possibly some movie nights. The members of the Open & Affirming Sub-Committee are: Shirlee Lendved, Tammie Huerth, Theresa Grimes, Chris Logterman, Dennis Kahn, and Pastor Bill.

We look forward to having open, honest, and respectful conversations with all members of our congregation, and are excited about embarking upon this journey with all of you.

#### STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The Stewardship Committee met on September 4. All members were in attendance; Pastor Bill, Barb Brock, Tom Litscher, Sherri Roberts, and Marcy Thurwachter. Dean Dahnert also attended as an ad hoc member.

Marcy distributed hand-outs from the August meeting with Rev. Andrew Warner who will be presenting at our church on Sept. 22. His presentation is titled "Leaving a Legacy, a discussion about the spirituality of generosity and the practicalities of making a gift as part of one's estate planning." The hand-outs were reviewed in detail.

Rev. Warner has charged the committee with "homework" which will augment his presentation, making it more specific and personal to First UCC. Committee members left with assignments and will be meeting again on Sept. 12.

On September 12, with all members present, the Stewardship Committee again met to prepare for Rev. Warner's presentation on Sept. 22. Marcy shared that she had just completed a webinar presented by Rev. Warner on conducting an annual campaign. Several good ideas were presented that could be implemented at First UCC. First on the agenda of assigned homework was a collaborative effort to bring together our "key hopes and enduring values" here at First UCC. Next the committee tackled the primary issue of where funds that are left to the church might be used. All members shared their thoughts and the group worked to incorporate these ideas into a useable directive for future funds. The results of these efforts will be shared with the finance committee and the consistory for additional input and direction.

Finally, a quick review of the updated Time & Talents survey was made. It is hoped that this survey will stimulate new involvement in church activities and service.

The next meeting is tentatively scheduled for October 10.
